The Enrichment Studies Unit at Queen's University in Kingston, Ontario has been offering academic enrichment opportunities to students in Grades 7 to 12 since 1987. Each year we attract approximately 2000 students who spend from three to five days studying an academically rigorous course and experiencing university life either as a commuter or in residence student.

Students participating in the Seven Eight Enrichment Days (SEEDS) program receive 15 hours of instruction offered in the state-of-the-art facilities used by Queen's students during their undergraduate and graduate studies while students participating in the Enrichment Mini Course (EMC) program receive 20 hours of instruction. Students experience what it is like to attend university and practice in the facilities that an undergraduate or graduate student would use. Courses are offered across the variety of fields of study available at Queen's University.

Students participating in the residence-option of our programs sample the entire University experience, by living in residence, eating their meals in the dining hall, and participating in extracurricular activities with other students from across Ontario and beyond.

Students who attend our programs learn beyond their regular classrooms and return to school with renewed energy, excitement for learning, ideas for future course planning, and future careers. We hope this student will receive funding assistance to enable them to participate in this wonderful opportunity.
