### Course Structure

Enrichment Online courses are designed to motivate and inspire independent learners. Participants will be taught by Queen's students, or community professionals with an affiliation to Queen's University. Instructors have worked hard to create courses which will engage participants and expand their academic experience. Students will complete daily modules and activities at their own pace, but should expect to spend 2-3 hours a day on course material.

### Live Sessions

Each course will include at least 2 live sessions for lectures, activities, or discussion opportunities. Live sessions are scheduled for Mondays and Fridays at 4:30 PM. Additional live sessions may be added at the instructors' discretion. Links to live sessions will be posted on the individual course onQ page. Students are expected to identify themselves by their first name and last initial, and must have an appropriate background.

### Course Access

Students will have access to their course as of Monday, October 26 at 9:00 AM. Registered students will continue to have access to course content until Monday, November 9 at 9:00 AM, however, discussion boards and access to instructors will conclude on Friday, October 30 at 5:30 PM.

### Supervision

During any scheduled live sessions, participants will be monitored by the course instructor. Another ESU staff member may join in and supervise live sessions at their discretion. Participants will not be permitted to have one-on-one live meetings with their course instructor.

## Technology Requirements

All of ESU's online programs will be hosted on onQ, Queen's Learning Management System (LMS). To ensure an enjoyable and quality experience, all registered participants should have access to the following:

1. Access to a working computer and reliable internet connection
2. Courses require students have webcam and microphone capability on their computer to participate in live video sessions

Google Chrome is the recommended browser when using onQ. It will give you the best possible user experience.
